Over 1,300 patients with kidney failure are treated each year at St George's Hospital. But right now, many of these patients are receiving blood dialysis in cramped, unsuitable conditions contained in temporary trailers in the car park. "HELP US IMPROVE PATIENT'S EXPERIENCE BY GETTING THEM OUT OF THESE TEMPORARY TRAILERS AND INTO A STATE OF THE ART RENAL DEPARTMENT" Our vision is for the Courtyard Clinic at St George's Hospital to undergo a full renovation and refurbishment to create a state of the art renal centre for patients with kidney failure.

In particular, we want to bring the kidney dialysis and outpatient services back under one roof in a modern and purpose-built facility.

The new facility will provide:

- 9 additional bays, bringing the capacity to 15 patients per session. Patients must dialyse 3 times a week, for around 4 hours each time, and our clinical teams run 3 shifts each day. This increase in space would therefore mean we could care for an extra 54 patients every week.
- A new meeting and seminar room space, equipped with media technology that will enable the interactive training of staff, students and, importantly patients (learning the options available to them, including home care and transplants).
- Improve the comfort and experience of all our patients, whilst ensuring our amazing staff can also feel inspired, motivated and excited to work here. This includes enhancing the waiting area with art, creating a space where patients can talk and support each other whilst having treatment, and allowing the clinical teams to work even more closely together.
