Who was Mary Seacole?

- Full name: Mary Jane Grant (Mother Seacole) 1805 -May 1881
- Occupation: Nurse and business woman



 Best known for: Her work in helping the sick and wounded – particularly during the Crimean War.

Mary Seacole faced unfairness and discrimination as a black women when she tried to volunteer as a nurse during the Crimean war .When she was tuned down she decided to go to Crimea independently .She set up a British hotel near the frontline to provide comfort and supplies to the army. When the war ended she was bankrupt, as she spent all her money on supplies.
