Many people that own their own home, will have Estates that are in excess of the Inheritance Tax threshold.

Accordingly, by leaving a legacy to charity, you may be able to greatly reduce the amount of tax your Estate pays on your death. It is sometimes possible to eliminate it altogether.

As a general rule:

- Gifts to registered charities are exempt from Inheritance Tax.
- Therefore, by leaving all of your Estate to a charity, or charities, no Inheritance Tax should be payable at all, and
- You can reduce the Inheritance Tax payable by making a bequest to a registered charity, even though you also leave a proportion of your Estate to family or friends.

In addition, the Budget in March 2011 provided a further incentive to charitable gifting, by announcing that if you choose to leave 10% or more of your Estate to charity, your entire Estate can benefit from a reduction in the actual rate of Inheritance Tax payable.

Therefore, if you choose to leave 10% or more of your estate to charity, this will have the effect of reducing the inheritance tax rate reduced 40% to 36%.
